Boom Lift Operator Training London - The cherry picker work platform is a type of work platform, which would typically have a platform or bucket at the hydraulic lifting system's end. The machine is likewise called a man lift, boom lift, hydraladder or basket crane.

The platform or bucket is occasionally mounted to or set unto a truck or other motor vehicle and is sometimes called a bucket truck. Other vehicles which can be made use of are stand-alone trailers, self-moving platform or flat back pickup vans. The person working stands inside the bucket and works from there. The individual within the bucket normally comprises an upper set of controls allowing manipulation of the bucket's position. The bucket's reach could be lengthened on some models by telescoping so as to adjust the lifting arm. Safety controls that are automatic prevent tipping. Articulated boom lifts are suggested for working within tight spaces or when it is needed to clear obstacles.

As the name implies, cherry pickers were constructed for picking fruit in trees at high levels. Cherry pickers are utilized in various other businesses, such as mining, exterior painting and construction. Occasionally they are utilized for cleaning windows on high building. The machines are utilized to service cable television, electrical equipment and telephone on utility poles. Sometimes, firefighters use cherry pickers, called snorkels, when ladders are inadequate. At Christmas time, civic workers could be seen inside cherry pickers hanging lights and banners.

Recommended training standards for safety awareness are set by local regulations. Curriculum includes safe operation procedures through a combination of hands-on and classroom components.

Sessions comprise the following topics: current regulation and applicable issues; general equipment safety factors; features of boom lifts; fall protection, scissor-lifts and different stationary work platforms.

Also included are the various responsibilities of the lift operator, such as: function test procedure; workplace inspections; avoiding and knowing hazards; equipment manufacturer's instructions and pre-operation inspections procedures.
